


How to get to Kumpula Campus from the Helsinki city center?

The Kumpula Campus is located ~6 km away from the Helsinki city center. The best way to get there is to take a bus from the Central railway station (Rautatientori). There are several bus lines that have a stop at Kumpula Campus. The ride takes about 15 minutes, depending on the traffic. In the table below, there are listed the numbers of some of the most suitable bus lines and the corresponding platforms, from which they leave at Rautatientori.






In addition to these bus lines, you can get to Kumpula using **trams number 6 and 8**.

When approaching from the city center, The Kumpula Campus is located on a small hilltop on the left-hand side. The bus stop is called Kumpulan kampus (Gumtäkts kampus in Swedish). A good landmark is the spherical antenna radome of the weather radar on the roof of the Physicum building, which can be spotted above the treetops (see the picture above). On the right-hand side, opposite the Campus, there is the Ar@bia mall.

The route on the map looks like this (line 55 has a different route)





After getting off of the bus, the final task is to cross the street and climb on the Kumpula hill. The conference takes place in the Exactum building. The bus line 55, however, has a different route from the other suggested ones and has a stop even closer to Exactum on Vainö Auerin katu called A.I. Virtasen aukio.

The price of a single ticket is 2.50€ if purchased beforehand from a ticket machine, or 3.00€ when purchased from the bus driver. It is also possible to buy day tickets from the machines or ticket outlets, e.g. 5 days ticket costs 24.00€ (see also <https://www.hsl.fi/en>).
